Councilman Dan Stalling said, "We don't even have any good data on what the pumps are actually pumping." Councilman Bernard Suchocki emphasized that "the whole water system has to be mapped; then we determine what has to be fixed in the system in what priority and how much it will cost" before applying for any bonds or state funds.

Mayor Richard Neverdousky suggested regular council workshops to standardize procedures and the capital approval process. Councilman Suchoki said he would meet on "Christmas, New Year's Eve-when-ever-to get the system fixed."

Ride For Heroes

The council approved a request from the Ride For Heroes chairman Dennis Thompson for a donation of \$2,000 to fund food and incidentals for this year's ride. The donation amount is the same as donated last year and will come out of the city's Community Promotion budget. Funds raised from the bike ride go to the three area volunteer fire departments. Willow Park is identified in the event materials and signage as a major contributor to the Ride For Heroes.

Other Business

In other business a site plan for the new Willow Park Eye Clinic was approved. The clinic will be located north of the highway and west of Ranch House Road.

James Moeller, a six-year Willow Park citizen and a residential construction manager in private life, was approved and appointed to be a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission. The application of Marvin Glasgow, former mayor and Planning and Zoning Commissioner, was denied on a three to one vote with only Mayor Pro-tem Gene Martin voting for approval.
